What is GreenScape?

GreenScape is a City and community partnership investment of beautification, clean-up, and planting in public spaces through the City. For the past 20 years, hundreds of projects have been initiated and adopted by individuals, community groups, neighborhood associations, etc.

When is GreenScape 2012?

GreenScape planting occurs annually in April. The projects are year-round commitments for care, watering, and weeding. This year's planting will take place on Saturday, April 21, 2012.

How do I get involved?

1.) Attend one of the organizational meetings. These meetings will assist you with ideas and lead you to other community resources. 2.) Select a neighborhood or community project site. Projects can include creating a new garden area or sprucing up an old one, litter and trash pick-up, or planting trees. If you're unable to find a project site, the City will be able to recommend areas. 3.) Complete and turn in material order form on or before March 7. 4.) Recruit volunteers to assist with material pick-up, site preparation, planting, year round watering and weeding. 5.) Enjoy the benefits of working together to create a more beautiful community.

When are the Organizational Meetings?

Organizational meetings will be held at 7 p.m. at the "Pip" Moyer Recreation Center on February 8 and *March 7 in meeting room 1 (*Plant Material Orders due at this meeting).

What if I need assistance in designing a garden?

Landscape architects, designers, and master gardeners have volunteered their time to assist in designing and selecting appropriate plant materials for projects that need assistance. Please attend one of the organizational meetings or contact a GreenScape Committee member for more information.

How do I order plant material?

Plant material and tree order forms are available at the organizational meetings or they can be picked up at the Pip Moyer Recreation Center after January 30th or downloaded from the City's Web site after that date. Go to www.annapolis.gov, then "Government", "Forms, Permits and Licenses", "Recreation and Parks". Deadline to order material is March 7.
